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# **Bronx RHIO Collaborates with Members on Research Projects**



Bronx RHIO launched its Subcommittee on Research and Quality Improvement in 2019, and since then it has collaborated on several research projects. Any Bronx RHIO member can participate in the Subcommittee and submit research proposals.

When reviewing project proposals, the Subcommittee considers potential impacts to Bronx RHIO data-contributing member organizations, to the population being researched, and to New York City as a whole, as well as whether the project is suitable for the use of Bronx RHIO data.

One completed project was led by the James J. Peters VA Medical Center investigating when and where veterans seek outside emergency services in order to reduce emergency department (ED) overuse and improve care transitions. Other projects in progress include:

- Examining the healthcare utilization patterns of HIV at-risk patients and whether certain patterns of care are associated with increased PrEP uptake and HIV seroconversion with Montefiore/Einstein;
- Studying the impact of the NYC DOHMH's Relay program on individuals with an opioid overdoserelated ED visit with DOHMH/NYU;
- Another Montefiore/Einstein study looking at the epidemiological risk factors impacting COVID-19 disease progression and mortality in the Bronx.

### Hixny: You Built It and They Came... But Will They Return? Part 2



In the last volume of NYeC News, Hixny CEO Mark McKinney spoke about the importance of data quality for HIE in a recent blog post. He also mentioned that, "in the current environment—where providers have numerous choices for accessing remote data—HIEs need to do more than just make quality data available. HIEs need to focus on making unique data available, through applications powered by SMART on FHIR technology, to ensure continued success."

This month, he returns with a new blog to discuss continued exploration of the technology and how HIEs, can use technology to showcase the breadth and depth of their capabilities.

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# Northwell Health Solutions, Using Healthix to Fill Gaps in Care



Northwell Health, one of the largest healthcare systems in the nation, currently uses the monthly Healthix Gaps in Care Report as an additional layer of information on top of its own data, to examine and fill patient gaps.

The Northwell VBC team used the Healthix reports from January through September 2021 and matched gaps of 11,766 patients.

"The significance of Healthix information is not in the mass volume of data available, but in the meaningfulness to close specific gaps for keystone patients...", said Kimon Stathakos, Senior Director, Operations at Northwell Health Solutions.

Complete care measures based on Healthix data allows the VBC team to submit the Healthix sourced information to payers as supplemental data. This has resulted in a one STAR increase across at least three payers so far which allows them to achieve key performance incentives/earnings.

Gaps in Care reporting is instrumental in identifying closed gaps previously unknown (e.g., patients who received care outside of network). The Gaps in Care report is helpful to improve HEDIS and QARR metrics, read the full report at the button below.

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# HealtheConnections and Diameter Health Publish Second Whitepaper



HealtheConnections has completed a new whitepaper in partnership with **Diameter Health**, titled: "Improving Ambulatory Clinical Quality Measurement Using a Consolidated Patient View".

Despite the successful adoption of EHRs, current approaches to quality measurement continue to be challenging. Healthcare organizations face significant hurdles in implementing and reporting electronic quality reporting due to inconsistent data formats, concerns of data completeness and accuracy, lack of structured data, and inconsistency in measure logic implementation.

HIEs can provide a more complete longitudinal patient record of aggregated data across sources back to their participating member organizations. HIEs could make it possible to measure quality across institutions in a patient-centric manner by gathering data wherever a patient seeks care, thus more accurately reflecting the quality of care provided.

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# Rochester RHIO Leverages Direct Secure Messaging to Boost Care Coordination



Rochester RHIO has partnered with health IT vendor Secure Exchange Solutions (SES) in efforts to boost data exchange and care coordination through direct secure messaging.

Implementing direct secure messaging will help to close communication gaps between physicians and healthcare providers for referrals, care coordination, and critical clinical event notifications, Rochester RHIO said.

"Rochester RHIO chose to partner with SES to ensure that our HIE participants have access to the highest rated Direct solution in the market," Andrea Richardson, CIO of Rochester RHIO, said in a public statement.

### **EP2 Program**

#### Last Call! Vital Audit Materials to Sunset December 31st, 2021

NY Medicaid EHR Inventive Program participants could be audited up to six years after receiving their incentive payment. Key program documents that can simplify a potential audit are scheduled to be taken offline December 31st including:

- Meaningful Use Registration for Public Health (MURPH) Audit Report Cards
  - A MURPH Audit Report Card document serves as the best evidence of a provider's history of active engagement with New York State Public Health Registries.
  - Log onto the MURPH now to download and save a copy of the MURPH Audit Report Card.
- Medicaid EHR Incentive Program Administrative Support Service (MEIPASS) Attestation Documentation
  - MEIPASS Attestation Document is a complete record of the information providers attested to during a specific Performance Year.
  - Log into MEIPASS, select the Performance Year desired, click "MEIPASS Attestation Document" to open a PDF copy of your attestation.your next application of Meaningful Use.

#### Security Risk Assessments Must Be Completed by December 31st, 2021

Providers that attested to completing their SRA at a future date must meet the December 31st deadline to retain their incentive payment. Those unable to meet the deadline will need to complete the self-report process to retract their attestation and refund their incentive payment.
